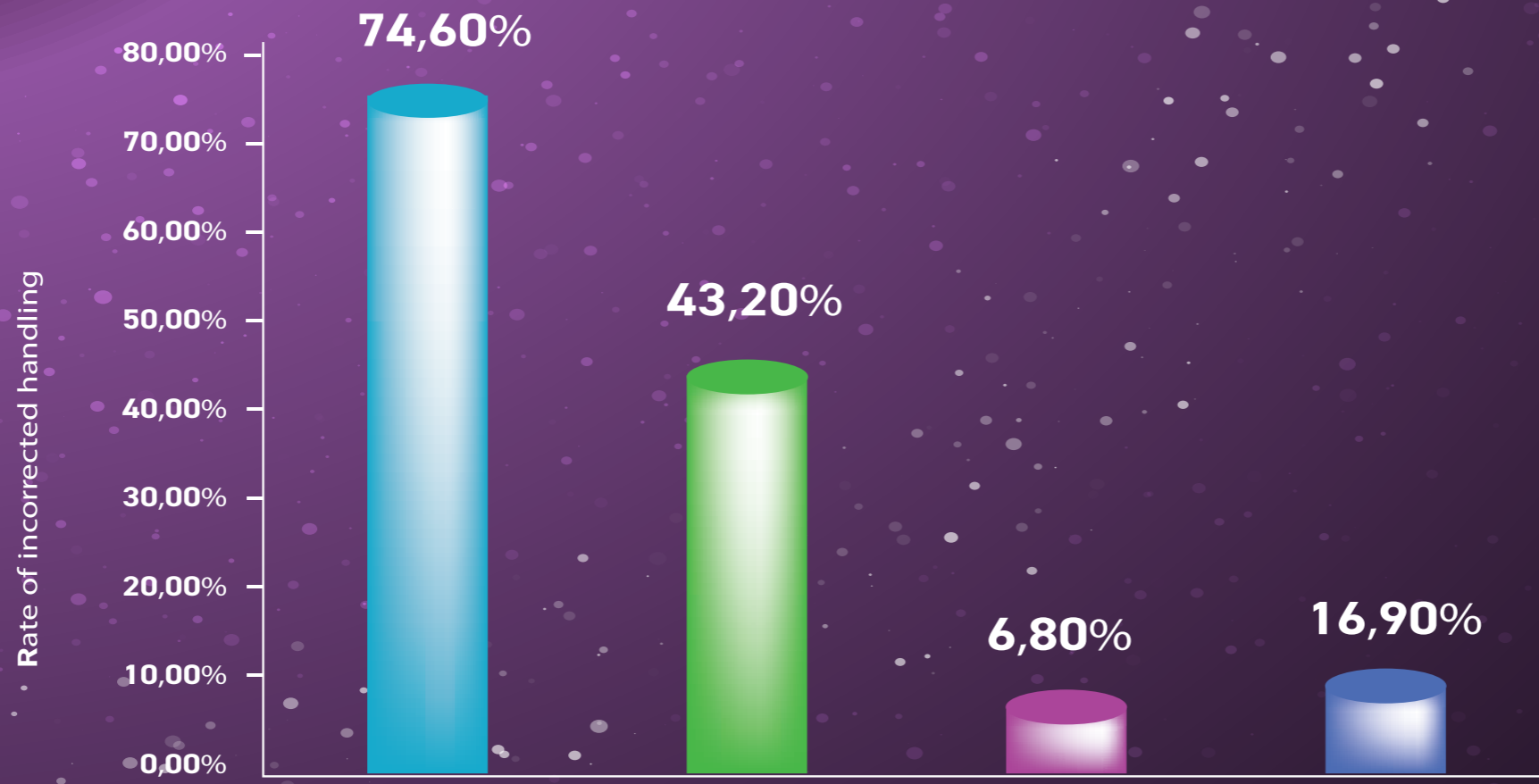


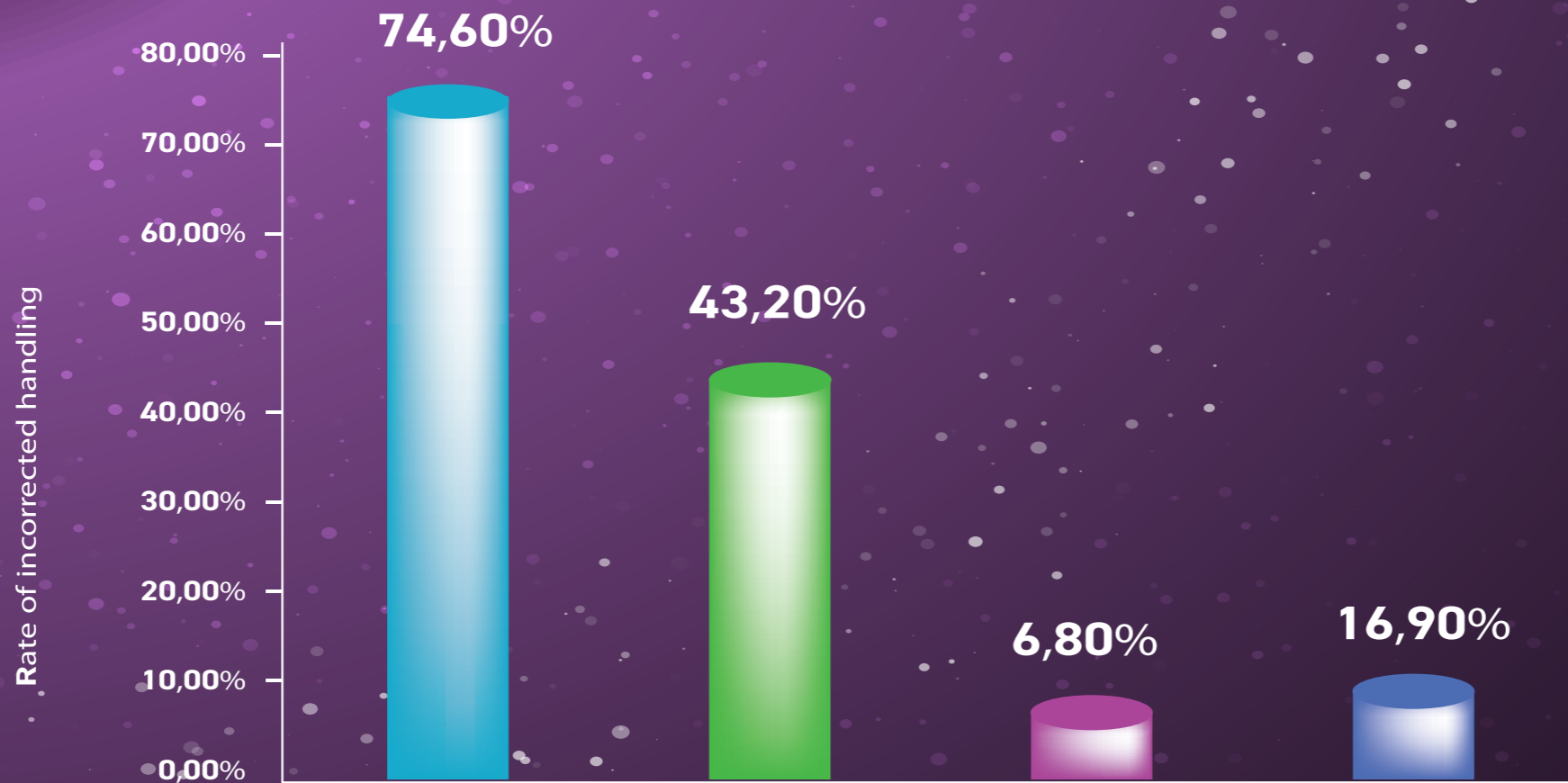
**Incorrect inhalation rate

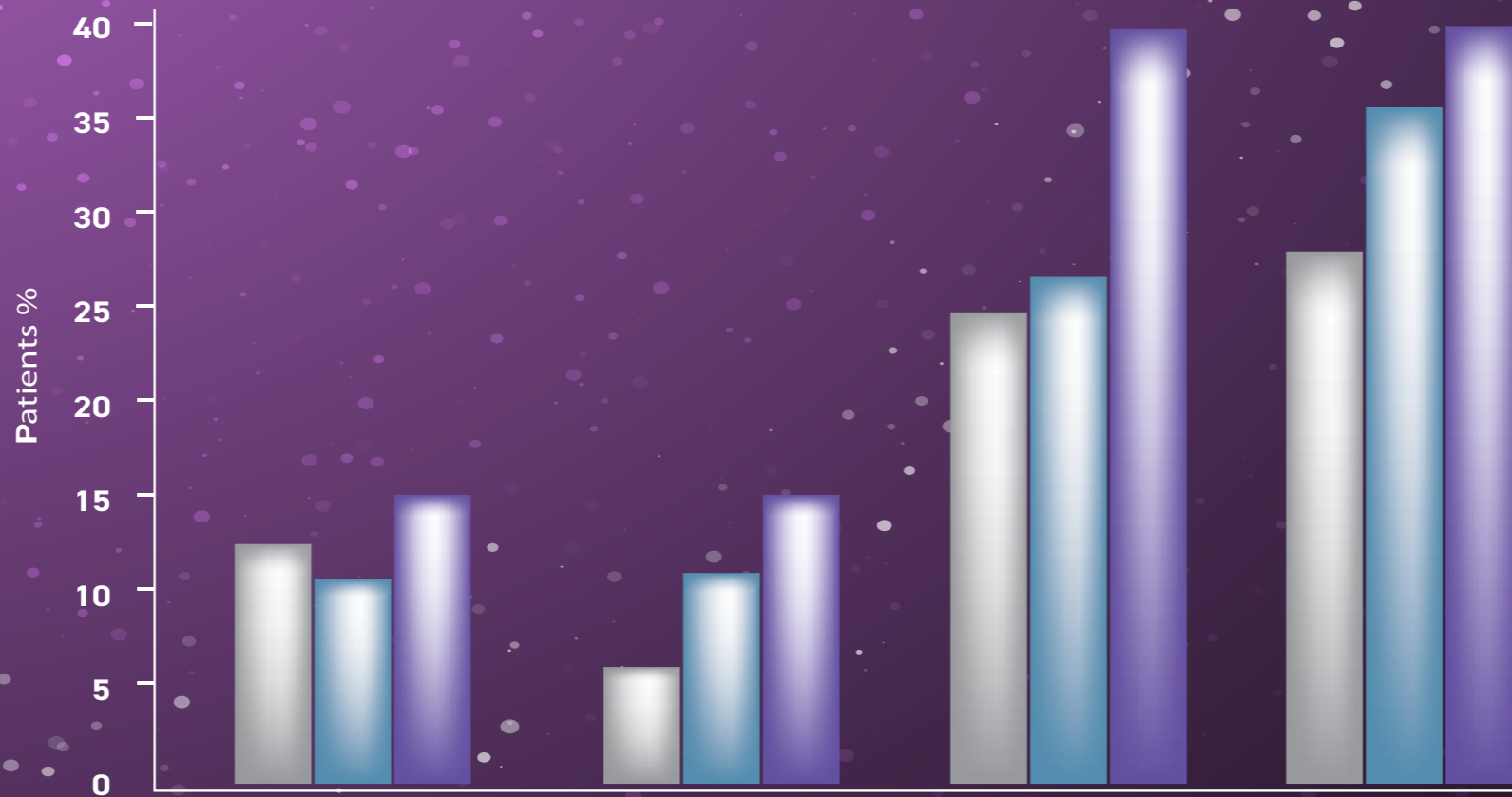

Assign an inhaler to an adequate proportion of patients committing at least one critical error in inhalation technique.



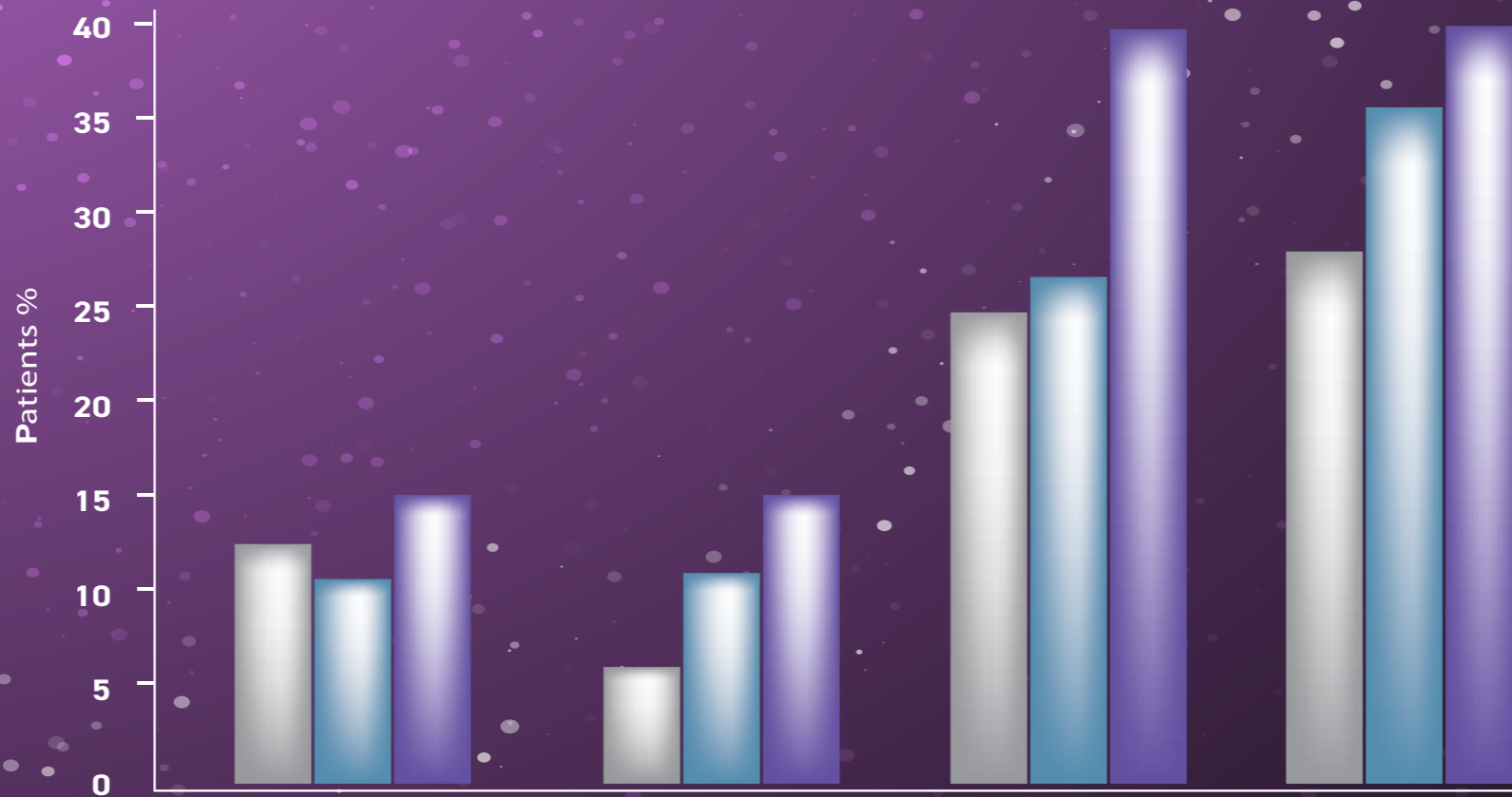


-  under 30 years
